SOS! TOKYO METRO EXPLORERS: THE NEXT (新 SOS 大東京探検隊)

In the summer of 2006, 5th grader Ryuhei Ozaki finds a mysterious journal titled "Tokyo Exploring Records". The text, written by his father Shohei when he was himself a kid, tells of a hidden treasure in the Tokyo underground. Together with his friends, Ryuhei forms a search team, heading through a manhole into a world that goes beyond imagination. Will the boys discover the "Treasure of Japan" hidden beneath the city, and be able to get past its fierce guardian and a whole lot of odd, yet friendly 'undergrounders'?

Kakurenbo: Hide and Seek (かくれんぼ)

Created by Shuhei Morita, director of the Oscar-nominated *Possessions* from the anime anthology movie *Short Peace*, this award-winning CG sci-fi horror anime is set in amongst the ruins of an abandoned old city, an eerie place where there is a game that only kids can play. In a twisted version of hide and seek where contestants are believed to be spirted away by demons, Hikora, joins the game with hopes of finding his missing sister, Sorincha. Lead on by a mysterious girl, will he discover the truth behind the game as one by one the children begin to disappear?

Planzet (プランゼット)

Set in 2053, *Planzet* is a full-CG animation film depicting a war between humans and space organisms. After Hiroshi Akishima's father is killed by alien lifeform codenamed FOS, he joins the Planetary Defence Forces Alliance, working his way up to be a pilot of the robot weaponry called 'GL'. Plunged into a final battle to decide the fate of the human race, now might just be Hiroshi's chance to get revenge.

Science Ninja Team Gatchaman: The Movie (科学忍者隊ガッチャマン)

Revolving around five teenage superheroes who together form the Science Ninja Team Gatchaman, this science fiction film is based on a popular anime series by the same name from the 70s. In order to defeat Sosai X who is the leader of Galactor, an evil alien terrorist organisation, the five superheroes arrive in their spaceship "Godphoenix" in the hopes of stopping Galactor's plans of world domination.
