


The Japan Foundation Touring Exhibition NINGYŌ: Art and Beauty of Japanese doll Available in the UK from February to mid-April 2026 (one venue only)



This exhibition offers visitors a fascinating opportunity to explore the world of the Japanese doll (Ningyō) and how the culture surrounding it was nurtured amidst the history and folklore of Japan. The Japanese word "Ningyō" is equivalent to the English "doll," but the characters it is composed of can be translated literally as "human shape."



The exhibition approaches Ningyō from four angles, in a roughly chronological order: "Ningyō to pray for children's growth," "Ningyō as fine art," "Ningyō as folk art," and finally the "Spread of Ningyō culture," wherein the exhibition further broadens its scope to include dolls as toys and dolls as contemporary art.

This exhibition is supervised by HAYASHI Naoteru of the Japanese Doll Culture Institute and MITA Kakuyuki of the Tokyo National Museum.

Exhibition Specification

The exhibition consists of a variety of Ningyō (Japanese dolls; 67 pieces in total) showcasing the history and development of Japanese doll culture.

Venue Requirements

Approx. 100m² floor space Environment protected from direct sunlight, high temperatures, and high humidity Display platforms (height 70-80cm, depth >40cm)
